MAYORAL MINUTES

The Mayor advised that the following items of general interest and Council business transacted through the period since the last Council Meeting.

- * The Mayor commented on how the rain had given a boost across the Shire.
- * The Mayor advised that on Wednesday, 11th May 2016, he had attended a meeting of the Murray Darling Basin Authority (MDBA). It was an opportunity to meet the new CEO, Mr Phillip Glyde and new Board Member, Susan Madden along with other staff members. The Mayor then gave an overview of the meeting in relation to the Northern Basin Review, that is currently being undertaken.
- * The Mayor advised that on Saturday, 14th May 2016, the Warren P & A Association held their Annual Warren Show Day. The weather was superb, with a very good attendance. The Mayor acknowledged the hard work undertaken by those responsible in putting the show on.
- * The Mayor advised that on the Wednesday,18th May 2016, he had undertaken an inspection of potential bore sites at Collie.
