GRANT APPLICATIONS FOR SHIRE IMPROVEMENTS

Applications to the Australian Government's Murray-Darling Healthy Rivers Program: Large Grants have been submitted for three projects aimed to improve Shire waterways.

The projects include \$1,800,000 for investigation and design work to upgrade the Bryan Egan Weir (Lower Warren Weir), which includes preparation work for an appropriate fish passage. An application for \$504,000 to ensure water supply to the Tiger Bay Wetlands, including

the installation of an Ultraviolet Disinfection System and pipeline from the New Sewerage Treatment Plant, and construction of a reed bed system at Tiger Bay Wetlands. The third application is for \$1,720,000 to install 25 Stormwater Quality Improvement Devices (SQIDs) at stormwater outlet locations across Warren that impact the Macquarie River and Gunningbar Creek.

In line with the Carter Oval Youth Sports Precinct including Warren War Memorial Swimming Pool Draft Masterplan, Council has also submitted two grant applications to the NSW Government's Greater Cities and Regional Sport Facility Fund 2021/22 Round 2 to improve the Warren War Memorial Swimming Pool. The applications include \$990,000 for upgrades to the amenities, kiosk, office and entry and \$350,000 for the construction of a Swimming Clubhouse.

ROADS, REHAB AND A ROLLER



Council recently purchased a new 22.5 tonne rubber-tyred roller. The Council-owned roller features the latest technology which enables work to be completed more efficiently and reduces the need to hire this type of machinery. A new front-mounted mower is now also available, replacing an older unit, and will allow Council to cover the landscape faster and more effectively.

After a successful application to the Fixing Local Roads Round 3, the \$1,719,813 construction for Ellengerah Road (Segments 22, 24 and 26) is underway. This work is funded with \$698,771 from the Fixing Local Roads - Round 2, Council contribution of \$174,693, \$211,587 from

Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program Phase 2 and \$634,762 from Fixing Local Roads Round 3.

Through another successful application to the Fixing Local Roads Round 3, the \$1,679,947 construction of Old Warren Road (Segments 26 and 28) has also commenced. This work is funded with \$1,259,960 from the Fixing Local Roads Program Round 3, \$296,147 from the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program Phase 2 and \$123,840 from the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program Phase 3.

The following maintenance is scheduled for November and December. This schedule is subject to wet weather.
