- ✓ Hold a current NSW driver's licence.
- ✓ Be an Australian or New Zealand Citizen, or a permanent resident of Australia.
- ✓ Live or work within a reasonable distance from your local fire station.
- ✓ Have daytime availability to respond to

Fire and Rescue NSW employs around 3300 highly trained, professional on-call firefighters throughout NSW to respond to emergencies and share a commitment to helping their local community. We are currently looking for firefighters in your area.

Our firefighters are a diverse group of men and women who balance their work, study and family commitments. They enjoy being part of a team, working with the community and other emergency services.

On-call firefighters provide a high standard of response to fire and emergency situations. All our firefighters use specialised vehicles and equipment to prevent and reduce the risk of fire, potential loss of life and property. HOW ARE 'ON CALL' FIREFIGHTERS PAID

On call firefighters are paid a fortnightly 'retainer' and an hourly rate for attending incidents, training and drills at the station. They also receive paid leave entitlements such as annual leave, sick leave, long service leave and employer contributions to your superannuation.

Rank	Fortnightly Retainer \$	Hourly rate \$
Recruit Firefighter	66.63	31.14
Firefighter	73.55	35.03

Firefighters are required to contribute \$16.34 per fortnight to Death & Disability Fund (tax deductible).
