MERRIGAL ROAD DAMAGE

The 'Dragon Gully' crossing on Merrigal Road (located within Segment 12 of the Merrigal Road) has been substantially damaged because of the recent rain. One of the culverts within the multi-cell culvert was washed out with one section of the plastic corrugated pipe being washed approximately 50m downstream. This section of road was impassable for several days.

The remaining section of the culvert that was impacted by the water damage was removed, and was back filled with heavy earth material. This allowed for the road to be re-opened for traffic movement. The repair is only temporary and may be scarred if heavy rainfall occurs prior to further road repair work being undertaken.

Further investigation will be undertaken at the site by Council staff in coming weeks. However, at this stage it is proposed to lower height of the existing roadway and to establish a concrete floodway at a level that is consistent with the natural waterway and the remaining culverts.

MAJOR PROJECTS

Warren Airport Upgrade

Work has commenced at the Warren Airport to develop this to a higher level and ensure that the Royal Flying Doctor, Air Ambulance, Rescue helicopters and general users have a safe facility to operate from. Council's Airport Committee has approved the following works to be undertaken:

- Installation of RNAV (for RFDS and Air Ambulance Operations) and an Automatic Weather Station,
- Repair and Resurfacing of the Main Runway 09/27, Taxiways and Aprons, including drainage,
- · Installation of Aircraft (AvGas) Fuelling Station (User Pays),
- Construction of Helicopter Landing Pad for Air Ambulance and Emergency Helicopters,
- Remarking of lines, end markings and Runway identification on Runway 09/27 including Taxiways,
- Grading, repairs and resurfacing to the Clay Runway 03/21, including drainage, and
- Installation of LED Runway Lights (If separate funding application is successful).

This work will take around 2 years to complete and will be subject to the airport operational needs.

All works being undertaken at the Airport are being paid for from grants received from both Federal and State Governments.

Two aircraft hangar sites sold - more available for sale

Do you need an aircraft hangar lot or do you know someone that does? Council at it's April Meeting agreed to the sale of the second aircraft hangar site at Warren Airport.

Council has sold 2 lots out of 8 and are looking for buyers to develop at the airport. The sites have been created for sale and have restrictions as to the time a building is to be constructed to ensure that the airport develops and the allotments cannot be purchased and held as vacant land.
