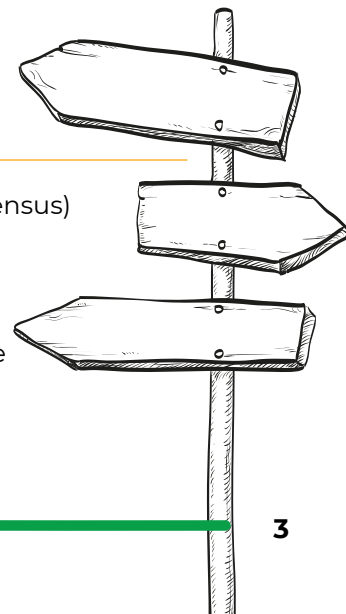

MACQUARIE MARSHES

The enchanting Macquarie Marshes are part of the Warren Shire with the welcoming township of Warren recognised as the “Gateway to the Marshes”.

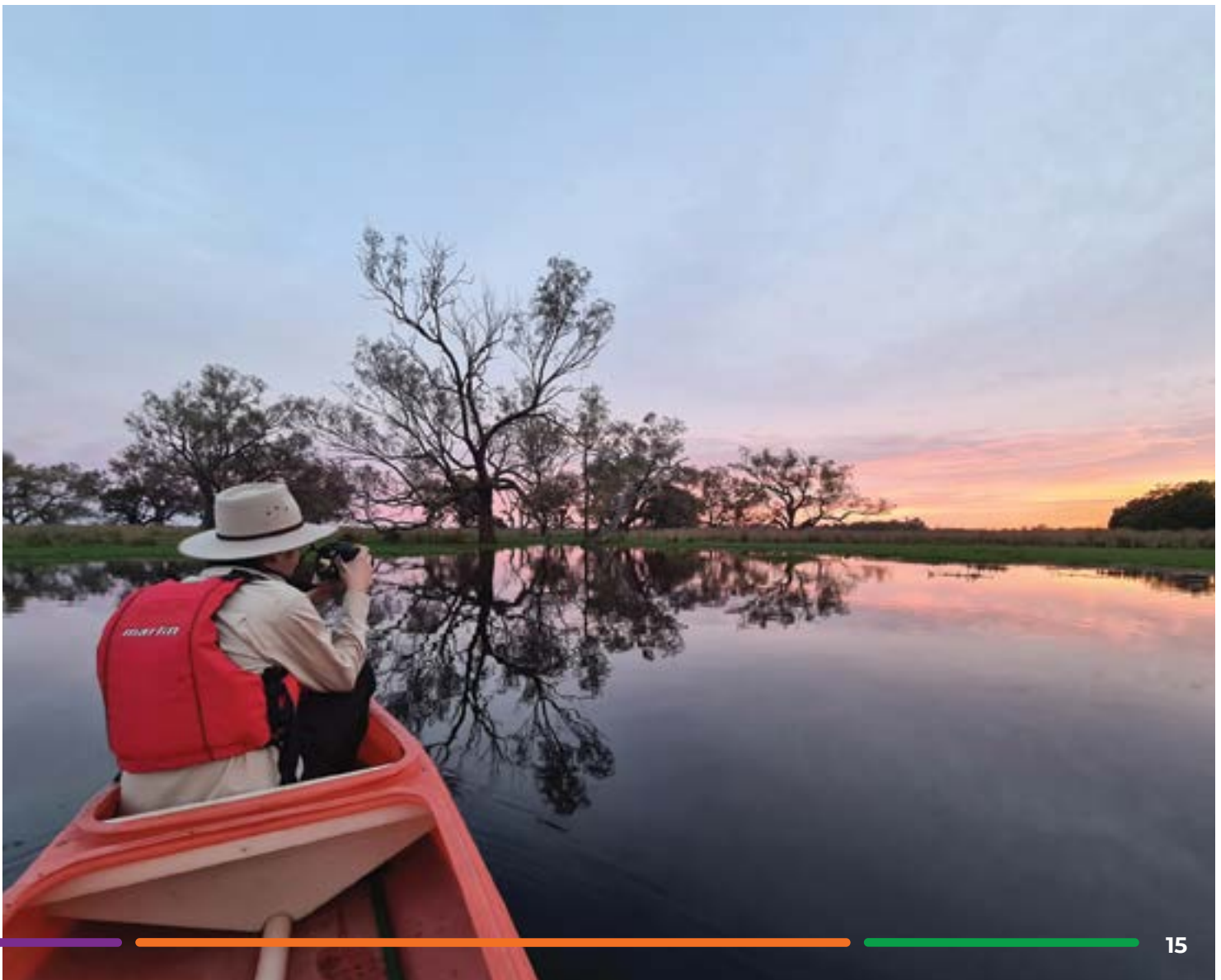
They are one of the largest remaining inland semi-permanent wetlands in south-eastern Australia and encompass extensive areas of reed swamp, water couch grasslands, red river gum woodlands and floodplains that cover an area of over 200,000 hectares.

The Macquarie Marshes are listed under the Ramsar Convention of Wetlands of International Importance. A haven for animals and birds, the Marshes are known as one of the most important nesting sites for waterbirds in Australia.

Incredible sunrises and sunsets await you after a day of birdwatching or bushwalking. Consider a stay in the Marshes for a night of magical stargazing, or when conditions permit, take a guided kayak tour or just marvel at the panoramic natural beauty of the Marshes from the Monkeygar or Terrigal Birdviewing Platforms.

And of course..... do not miss the opportunity to walk the sensational Burrima Boardwalk!

BURRIMA BOARDWALK

Nestled in the Macquarie Marshes, is the Burrima Boardwalk, built and managed with the aim of restoring and conserving wetland and floodplain habitat.

Delight in a leisurely 2km stroll amidst river red gums and reeds, accompanied by an exceptional observation tower offering a breathtaking view over the expansive northern reedbed. This intriguing tourist destination highlights the Macquarie Marshes, providing visitors with an accessible, up-close and immersive experience of this unique natural location.

An ephemeral wetland environment where you may see and hear a wide range of diverse plant and animal species. An up close and personal experience you will not forget.

Burrima Boardwalk is accessible for mobility scooters, walkers and wheelchairs.

Bring a picnic to enjoy, al fresco style, under the trees or covered tables, view the magnificent wetlands from the heights of the bird viewing platform, and soak in all the sights and sounds of this extraordinary natural landscape.

If you were any closer to the Macquarie Marshes.... You would be wadding in it!

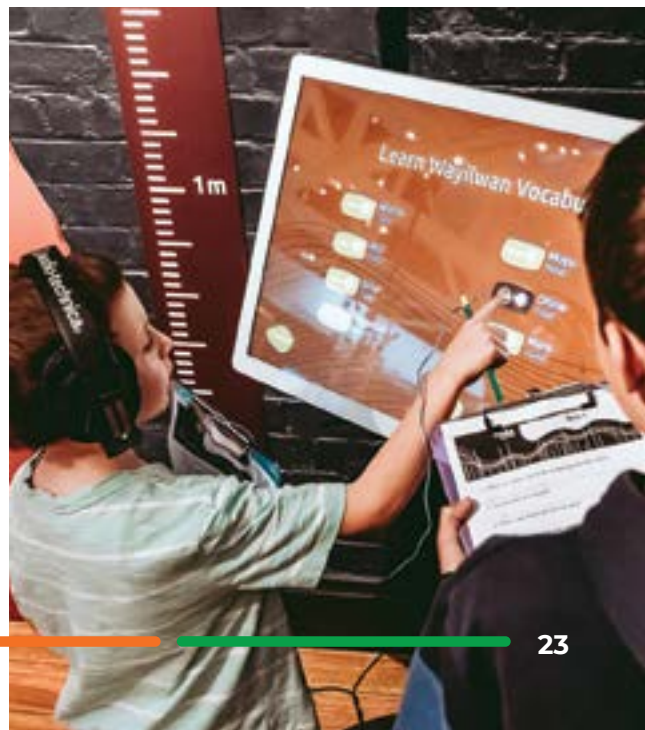
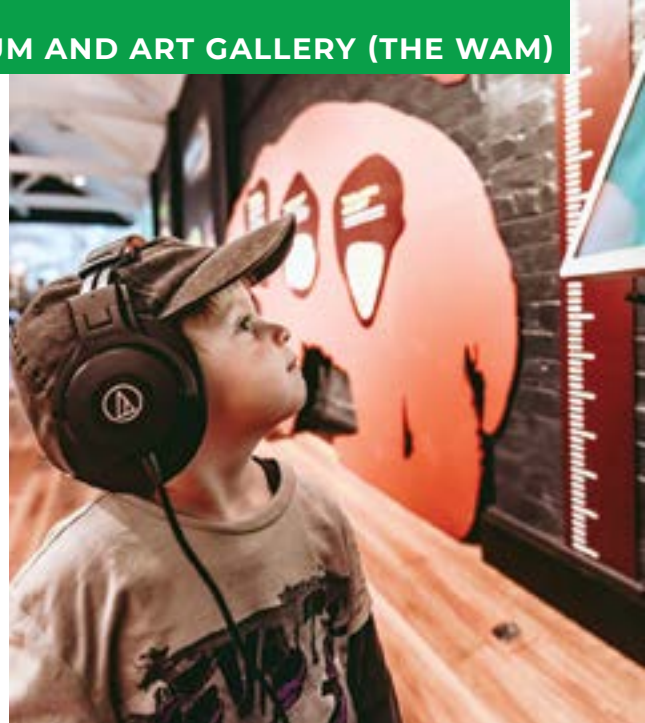

The Warraan Widji Arts Centre was previously the Mechanics Institute/ Shire Library and was built in 1876.



Warraan Widji Arts Centre was established in October 2021, founded on respect for our Elders and our Wayilwan ancestors.



The Building was gifted to Warraan Widji Arts from members of the community.

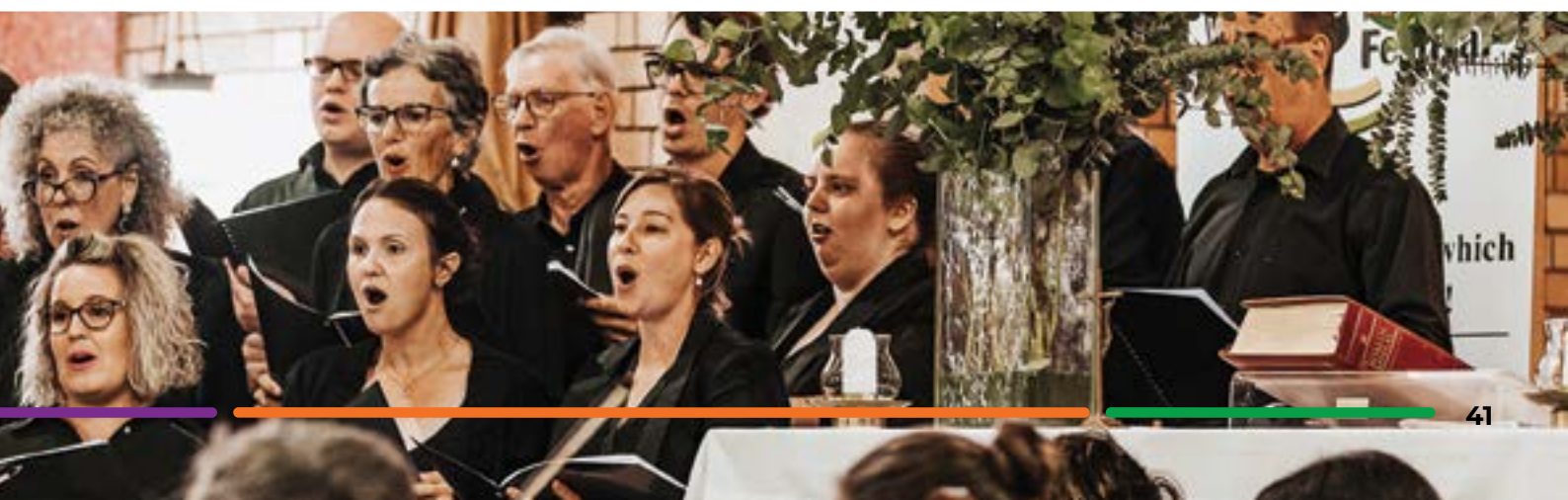

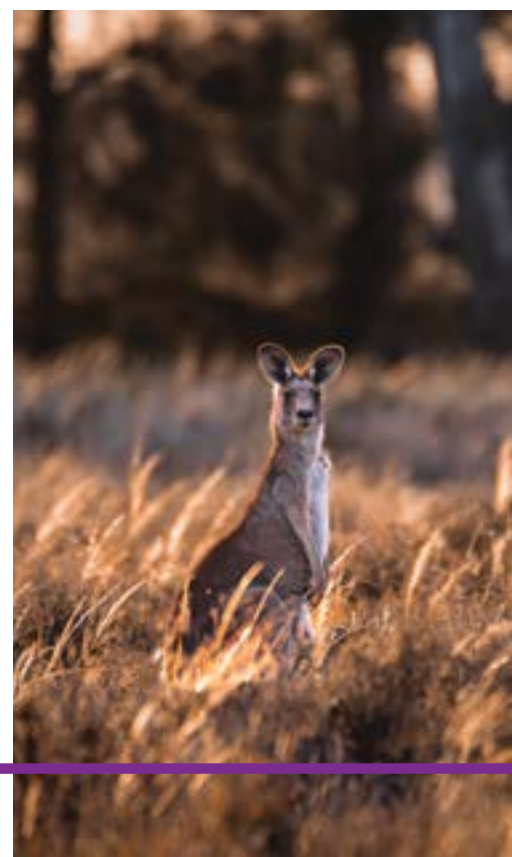

Step Back in Time

The township of Warren was gazetted in June 1861 as a farming settlement and quickly became known for its lush landscapes and fertile soil, ideal for agriculture.

As you drive around Warren, you will see its agricultural roots continuing to grow in the sprawling fields and paddocks dotted in the landscape.

Visit our historic main street or local Library where stories and photos will tell a story of the town's evolution from a modest farming community to a thriving small town.

The Warren Historical and Family History Society holds a vast collection of books, maps, cds and dvds (including the Julie Dern Collection), photographs, and

documentation for those interested in researching their connections to our town.

An old garage building has been converted into a museum offering a glimpse into Warren's industrious past, and hosting artifacts that illustrate the daily lives of our early settlers.

A visit to Warren is a step back in time to experience the warmth and charm of rural life.

Our town may be small, but its heart and history are as vast as the countryside that surrounds it.

WARREN HISTORY TIMELINE

- 1818** John Oxley and his party explore the region.
- 1828** Charles Sturt and his party explore the region.
- 1830s** The first settlers move into the area.
- 1846** Thomas Mitchell and his party explore the region.
- 1847** The first race meeting held about 6kms east of Warren.
- 1861** Warren proclaimed as a town.
- 1880** The first Warren show was held on 3rd May.
- 1882** Railway line from Dubbo to Nevertire opened.
- 1885** Nevertire proclaimed a village.
- 1896** The Nevertire Cyclone destroyed most of Nevertire.
- 1898** Railway from Nevertire to Warren opened. There were two trains in and out of Warren six days a week.
- 1899** The Great fire destroyed two thirds of Warren.
- 1901** The population of Warren was 1006 of which 13% were Chinese.
- 1914–1918** 300 men and 2 women served in the First World War, 41 did not return.
- 1920–1982** Aboriginal families lived at the Beemunnel Reserve.
- 1939–1945** 307 men and 16 women served in the Second World War, 21 did not return.
- 1950–1953** 3 men served in the Korean war. All returned.
- 1951** The most destructive bushfire experienced in the district occurred.
- 1955** Record flood of 10 metres.
- 1957** Warren Shire formed with the amalgamation of Marthaguy and Warren Shires.
- 1962–1975** 10 men served in the Vietnam war. All returned.
- 1988** Tiger Bay Wetlands opened in Warren.
- 2011** Celebrations for the 150 year anniversary of Warren.
- 2016** Beemunnel gazetted as 'an Aboriginal Place' and enhancement works commence.
